Small in size, but high in wildlife, Lake Nakuru makes the ideal day trip, en route to other

destinations and abounds in picturesque lookouts and picnic spots.

As Kenya's first and largest rhino sanctuary, sightings of both black and white rhino are almost guaranteed, while plentiful waterbuck, warthog, zebra, gazelle and buffalo graze the shoreline.

Echoing to the haunting cries of the numerous fish eagles, Lake Nakuru is also the park in which you have the best chance of seeing a leopard.

Wildlife highlights: lion, black and white rhino, waterbuck, hippo, leopard, impala, gazelle, hyena, wild cat, golden cat, hyrax, colobus monkey, and Rothschild's giraffe. Birds: 1.5 million flamingos and 450 other recorded species.
